He has published more than 650 scientific papers, reviews and book chapters, with numerous research articles in peer-reviewed journals including the *New England Journal of Medicine*, the *American Journal of Respiratory and Critical Care Medicine*, the *Journal of Clinical Investigation*, the *European Respiratory Journal*, *Chest* and *Lancet Respiratory Medicine*. He has lectured nationally and internationally at numerous scientific meetings and congresses.
